Entries

All Nat Status entries are considered provisional pending payment of entry fees (AED 2,050 including Testing or AED 1,750 Race Entry fee for Registered UAE Sportbike Championship competitors, UAE Touring Car Championship competitors and competitors in all other classes in the NGK Racing Series; AED 2,400 including Testing or AED 2,000 Race Entry fee for Non-Registered UAE Sportbike Championship and UAE Touring Car Championship Competitors; AED 4,800 including Testing or AED 4,500 Race Entry fee for NGK 3H Enduro) in full. Payment can be made via credit card, in cash in person by coming to the Dubai Autodrome (Sunday – Thursday, 09:00 – 17:00hrs) or via cheque.

Event A: Int Status Lamborghini Super Trofeo Middle East

Event B: Nat Status UAE Sport Bike Championship

Event C: Nat Status NGK Racing Series incl. UAE Touring Car Championship

Event D: Nat Status NGK 3H Enduro

Eligible Competitors

All competitors in Events A, B, C & D must be holders of current, valid and relevant Race License from a recognized ASN. All competitors must have passed the appropriate Medical and meet any other requirements applicable to the event, its status and/or championship or race/event in question. In addition the competitors must have permission to compete from their license issuing ASN in accordance with Article 70 of the ISC of the FIA. Licenses, Medical Certificates and permissions will be examined at signing-on.

Entry Definitions

Each entry will qualify the competitor for a listing in the official program of the sponsor/team name. This listing will be a maximum of six words and must contain no offensive or misleading statements. All other national restrictions on certain types of advertising must be respected.

Close of Entries:

Entries close at 17:00hrs on **Thursday, 23rd February 2017.**

Late Entries MAYBE considered with a late entry fee of AED 500, subject to the Championship organizers written approval.

No entries whatsoever will be accepted after 17:00hrs, **Monday, 27th February 2017.**

CHIEF TIMEKEEPER:

Acceptance and Refusal of Entries:

In accordance with the Sporting Regulations of the Championships (Article 2.1)

Results and Protests:

Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after each race. Protests should be made in accordance with the Articles 172, 173 and 174 of the present Code. The National Protest fee is AED1,500 with a bond of AED 10,000 and National Appeal Fee is AED 5,000. The International Protest fee is AED 8,000 and Appeal fee is Euro 6,000. All protest fees are to be made in cash only.

Start Positions:

The specific format for the events and qualification for races will be set by Championship Regulations or be advised by the organizers in Final Instructions or an official event bulletin/briefing.

Scrutineering Etc:

All vehicles must comply with Vehicle, Formula and tire regulations. In accordance with Article 128 of the Code, all vehicles must have suitable and sufficient protection for the prevention of passage of flame between engine and drivers seat.

Insurance

All competitors are insured in respect of Third Party Public liability during official testing, practice and racing. They are strongly advised to make their own arrangements with regard to personal accident/injury cover and cover for damage to their vehicles and those of other competitors taking part.

Grids:

Should the entries of cars in each of the races on this event exceed 30; the organizing committee reserves the right to split the grid into two separate races on the grounds of safety.
